9:00 -9:45 **ROI Lidar Project on the Superior South Shore**

Speaker: Scott Galetka - Bayfield County Land records Administrator/LIO

This presentation is about the South Shore LIDAR Project. Bayfield County was the lead on obtaining grant funding through Department of Administration and NOAA. Bayfield County's main objective was to obtain funding for LIDAR to help with Coastal setback ordinance. Although Bayfield County had one purpose we had an opportunity to work with partners that included the DOA, City of Superior, Ashland, Red Cliff, National Parks Service, and USGS to expand the project to the entire South Shore. This is a good example of a project extending across multiple levels of government to acquire data for many uses.

9:45 - 10:15 **Using GIS to Evaluate Transportation Investments**

The stimulus bill provides many funding opportunities for transportation and other infrastructure investments. This presentation will provide an overview of UW-Madison research that utilizes GIS for cost-benefit analysis of public transportation, evaluating sustainable travel alternatives, and transportation modeling.

10:30 – 11:15 **Local and Regional Analysis of Foreclosure Cases**

Speaker: Dr. Russell Kashian - Department of Economics, UW – Whitewater

Speaker: Matt Kures - GIS State Specialist UW – Extension, Center for Community and Economic Development

The current economic downturn has placed attention on a number of economic indicators, including foreclosures. While several private companies track foreclosures trends, these data sets do not provide the geographic detail necessary to target foreclosure abatement and assistance programs. However, foreclosure case filings reported in Wisconsin's Consolidated Court Automation Programs (CCAP) system provide a unique opportunity to examine foreclosure trends at various temporal and geographic levels. This session examines how CCAP listings are being used to identify foreclosure case hot spots and perform spatial econometric analyses that are informing foreclosure public policy initiatives.

11:15 – 12:00 **Mapping WI Department of Revenue Real Estate Transfer Data**

This presentation offers an introduction to methods of processing and mapping State of Wisconsin Electronic Real Estate Transfer (eRETR) data. You will be shown how agencies may access this data along with GIS applications. A brief update on the DOR Integrated Property Assessment System(IPAS) project will also be included.

Organizations around the world have woken up to the fact that economic growth in the 21st century will largely be driven by attracting the best businesses and the best people to their jurisdictions. Today, almost 80% of the site selection research is done remotely using the Internet where more and more Economic Development organizations are looking towards web based GIS to help them achieve their goals. Within this presentation, I will demonstrate to you how a handful of Economic Development organizations are utilizing GIS by taking a "DEEP DIVE" into the real questions at hand. So, when we talk about possible Economic Development solutions, what are we really talking about? Are we talking about (a) Site Selection, (b) the Underlying Data being provided, or (c) the real "Drivers and/or Reasoning" behind developing the Economic Development application in the first place? The answer is really a combination of ALL THREE and as you will see, GIS plays a BIG part in that process. This presentation will take a look at how a few different Economic Development organizations such as Georgia Power, Dubai Economic Development and other agencies, such as the National Land Agency of Jamaica, are utilizing GIS web mapping tools for driving economic development within their jurisdictions.
