Wisconsin Land Information Association 2016 Pre-Conference Workshop Incorporating Historical Map Images into GIS and Web Maps

Historical maps can lend insight into contemporary issues related to real estate, environmental pollution, land use, genealogy, and plain old curiosity about one's surroundings. And as scanning technology and digital storage space become less expensive, an ever-increasing variety of high-resolution digital maps are available free or low-cost for use in GIS or Web maps. In this workshop, we'll explore some of the emerging tools that make it easier to incorporate historical map images into your GIS or Web map projects. Learn simple methods for georectification, preparing the image as a web service, adding user-controlled transparency, and other tips for seamless integration. We'll also look at how to find and access old maps of interest to Wisconsin users, including from the AGS Library at UW-Milwaukee and the Wisconsin Historical Society, as well as from other national and international repositories.
