Minnesota's Experience with Free and Open Public Geospatial Data

Geoffery Maas, MetroGIS

As of August of this year, 19 of Minnesota's 87 counties have made their geospatial data freely and openly available; this includes parcel data, roads, address points, aerial imagery and many other useful data sets. This change represents a "180-degree turn" from prior policies regarding data availability. Under state statute, cities and counties in Minnesota have the ability to charge for and license the geospatial they create. MetroGIS Coordinator and information policy researcher Geoff Maas will provide an overview of the changes taking place in Minnesota, and what kinds of actions and decisions have led up to this new direction.

The Big Ten Academic Alliance Geospatial Data Project serves as an access point for openly available geospatial resources, including GIS data, imagery, and scanned historical maps. The aim of this project is to facilitate the discovery process by aggregating metadata records and creating a single search interface that covers multiple states. In this presentation, Karen Majewicz will review the project's established collaborative workflow, including the metadata tools utilized for collection, transformation, and editing geospatial metadata records and demonstrate the project's public geoportal, built with GeoBlacklight.

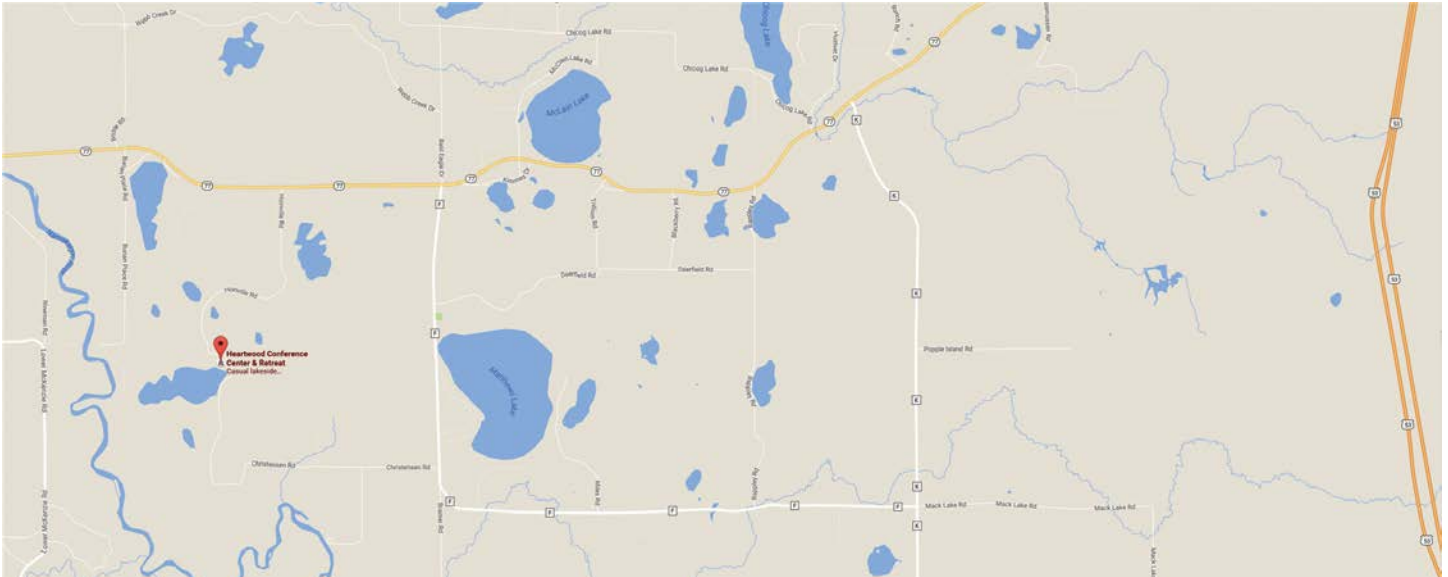
